High West Energy 2021 Annual Meeting Minutes Pine Bluffs, WY | June 17, 2021

The 84th Annual Meeting of the members of High West Energy, Inc., was held from High West Energy's headquarters in Pine Bluffs, WY, and via video conference at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 17, 2021. Following registration, dinner, and a vendor show, the meeting was called to order by President Ed Prosser who serves the members in District 13.

The invocation was given by Dave Crouse, CIO of High West Energy

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Prosser welcomed the members, employees, and fellow board members in attendance and virtually. He discussed the medical and economic hardships created by COVID and High West's reputation as a concerned and supportive member of the communities we serve. In 2020 we worked with local hospitals, groups and other community nonprofit organizations to help people through hard times. In total, we donated more than \$30,000 to support local healthcare providers, youth teams, and food banks. The co-op also helped nearly 100 individuals through Operation Round Up assisting with financial support. High West also supported 20 outstanding students with \$15,000 in college scholarships, an essential investment in the future of our communities.

CFO/INTERIM GENERAL MANAGER REPORT

CFO/Interim General Manager Lindsay Forepaugh reported on the choices High West made throughout 2020, some were in part of our long-term plans and others due to COVID and evolving quickly as circumstances changed frequently. Employees stepped up and performance was outstanding as they remained flexible and never lost sight of our goal to provide reliable, affordable electricity. We set a new standard for service reliability by having the lowest number of outages in over ten years. Total margins in 2020 were \$2.7 million, the fourth best in our history, confirming that the financial health of High West continues to be strong.

As more people move into the area and existing members start or expand their business, High West is working to meet the needs of our growing membership. Our subsidiaries, High West Digital Solutions and High West Wiring also continue to grow and prosper.

The High West family of companies rolled out modern, new websites for all three business in 2020, giving members easy access to information on computers, tables, and smartphones.

OFFICIAL MEETING NOTICE

The reading of the 2021 Notice of Annual Meeting was given by Hank Bailey, Attorney at Law and General Counsel for High West Energy, Inc., whose firm has represented the cooperative for 43 years. It was determined that a quorum was present and that the business of the meeting could move forward. It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved to dispense with the reading on the 2020 annual meeting minutes and to approve them as presented.

ELECTIONS

Hank Bailey presided over the election. The business of the meeting was to take action upon the following matter:

The Nominating Committee submitted the names of Michael Lerwick from District 11, Ed Prosser from District 13, and Kosha Olsen and Kristie Bibbey from District 16, as nominees for three-year terms. Because there were no additional candidates for District 11 and District 13, Michael Lerwick and Ed Prosser were automatically elected to the board in accordance with High West bylaws, Article II Section 5, and Article III Section 3.

ELECTION RESULTS

The election committee counted all ballots cast for District 16. Hank Bailey announced that Kosha Olsen was the winner.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS & GENERAL DISCUSSION

There was no new business.

MISCELLANEOUS

President Prosser announced door prizes and the progressive cash jackpot would be awarded after the meeting was adjourned.

As there was no other business brought before the membership, President Prosser called for adjournment. There was a motion and a second. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned at 7:08 p.m.
