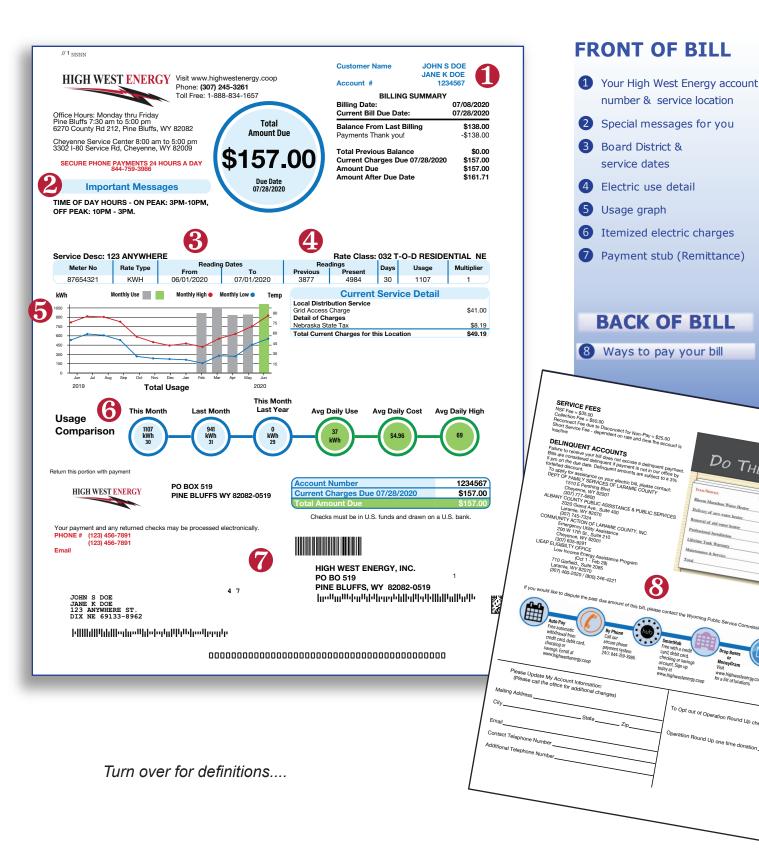
Understanding Your Bill

Definitions to help you understand your electric bill:

Peak Capacity Charge – Measured in kilowatts (KW) this is the peak amount of current running through your electric meter in a one-month period.

Power Generation Service and Energy Production Charge – The wholesale cost that High West pays for electricity to the organization that generates power.

Transmission Service and Delivery Charge – The cost required to transport power from the site of generation to High West's infrastructure.

Local Distribution Service, Delivery Charge and Grid Access Charge* - The cost to bring power through High West's infrastructure to your home, farm or business.

*Grid Access Charge- A monthly charge that offsets some of our fixed service and maintenance costs and exists regardless of usage. Based on the size and type of service.

Kilowatt-Hour (KWH) – One kWh is the energy needed to power ten 100-watt light bulbs for one hour, or one 100-watt light bulbs for ten hours.

Multiplier – Converts units measure by a meter to account billing usage.

Operation Round-Up - An optional High West Energy program where electric bills can be "rounded-up" to the next dollar. The money is used to help our members and community through difficult or tragic times.

Contract Minimum – A charge derived from the construction of the service which allows the construction costs to be paid over a five-year time frame. The minimum includes any usage and the grid access charge, and the account may be billed a contract minimum in order to reach the contract amount.

Time-of-Day – A rate that bills the member on peak and off-peak usage based on the time of day the energy is used.

SmartHub – The ebill site that allows a member to register and view account information and pay their bill.
